### Regulatory Reinvention within the DEQ

When Governor Snyder last year called on his newly-created Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) to take a hard look at Michigan's regulatory structure, it started a statewide conversation between regulators and stakeholders.

The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) was among the top agencies responding to the call for a regulatory reform. Snyder's Executive Order 2011-5 created a 12-member Environmental Advisory Rules Committee, composed of manufacturing

representatives, utility representatives, environmental consultants and attorneys, a representative from the environmental community, and the DEQ's Director of Policy and Legislative Affairs.

The LARA's Office of Regulatory Reinvention (ORR) led the effort and chaired the committee. Members were charged to provide recommendations to the ORR for changes to Michigan's environmental regulations.

The committee met 33 times between June 15 and November 17, 2011. The group tackled the DEQ's compendium of environmental regulations, analyzing thousands of regulations in search of rules that were outdated, no longer useful or unnecessarily burdensome to the regulated community.

DEQ staff and leaders were invited to answer questions and provide additional information and feedback on proposed changes to the way Michigan addresses environmental cleanups and regulates impacts to its air, water and soil. Several recommendations also addressed department-wide policy and procedures or non-rule regulatory actions.

The ORR submitted its final list of 76 recommendations in a report to the Governor on December 23 and the DEQ now awaits direction on which proposed changes to implement. The goal, ultimately, is that DEQ will get to remove some burdensome and obsolete regulations, provide more clarity and certainty for the regulated community, and increase stakeholder involvement in the development of DEQ's administrative rules and policy and procedures.

## DEQ Evaluating Incremental Sampling Strategy

Incremental Sampling (IS) is a developing sampling protocol designed to reduce data variability and increase sample representativeness. The objective of IS (also referred to as Multi Increment Sampling (MIS) and Incremental Sampling Methodology (ISM)) is to obtain a single sample for analysis that has an analyte concentration representative of a particular area of concern (i.e., the decision unit). This is achieved by collecting a sufficient number of discrete “increments” (typically 50 – 80) in an unbiased manner from throughout a specified area, and then combining and processing the “increments” to obtain a representative aliquot for analysis. This can result in the collection of a more representative and defensible data set than that obtained by typical discrete sampling methods.

The US Army Corps of Engineers, Department of Defense, EPA Region 9, Alaska, and Hawaii have IS guidance documentation available. The Interstate Technology and Regulatory Council (ITRC) are expected to finalize IS guidance in early 2012.

Incremental Sampling can be used as a sampling strategy to meet cleanup program objectives at contaminated sites in Michigan. The DEQ is interested in partnering to find sites that could be used as IS case studies.

## Our Company

Our environmental stewardship story stretches back more than a century to when our company's founders harnessed the flow of Michigan rivers to bring the life-changing benefits of electric power to communities scattered across our fledgling state.

In the future, we plan to make more investments to preserve Michigan's environment. This includes additional investments in clean, renewable energy projects and emission control equipment for our generating plants. Consumers Energy already is by far the largest supplier of renewable energy in the state.

Today, about 5 percent of the power we supply to customers comes from Michigan-based renewable sources including hydro, wind, biomass, landfill gas and anaerobic digestion. By the end of 2012, about 8 percent of our power supply will come from green sources, growing to 10 percent in 2015.
