Do I need a permit to discharge wastewater from vehicle washing activities at municipally owned vehicle maintenance facilities?


This document identifies wastewater regulatory permit programs related to wastewater that is generated by the cleaning of the exterior of vehicles at municipally owned non-public vehicle maintenance facilities.

Various regulatory agencies implement permit programs to decrease the potential for environmental harm from wastewaters, including vehicle washing wastewater, based upon wastewater destination. In general, the state of Michigan, Department of Natural Resources and Environment (DNRE) regulates wastewater that goes directly to surface and groundwaters of the state and locally-operated wastewater treatment authorities regulate wastewater that is sent
